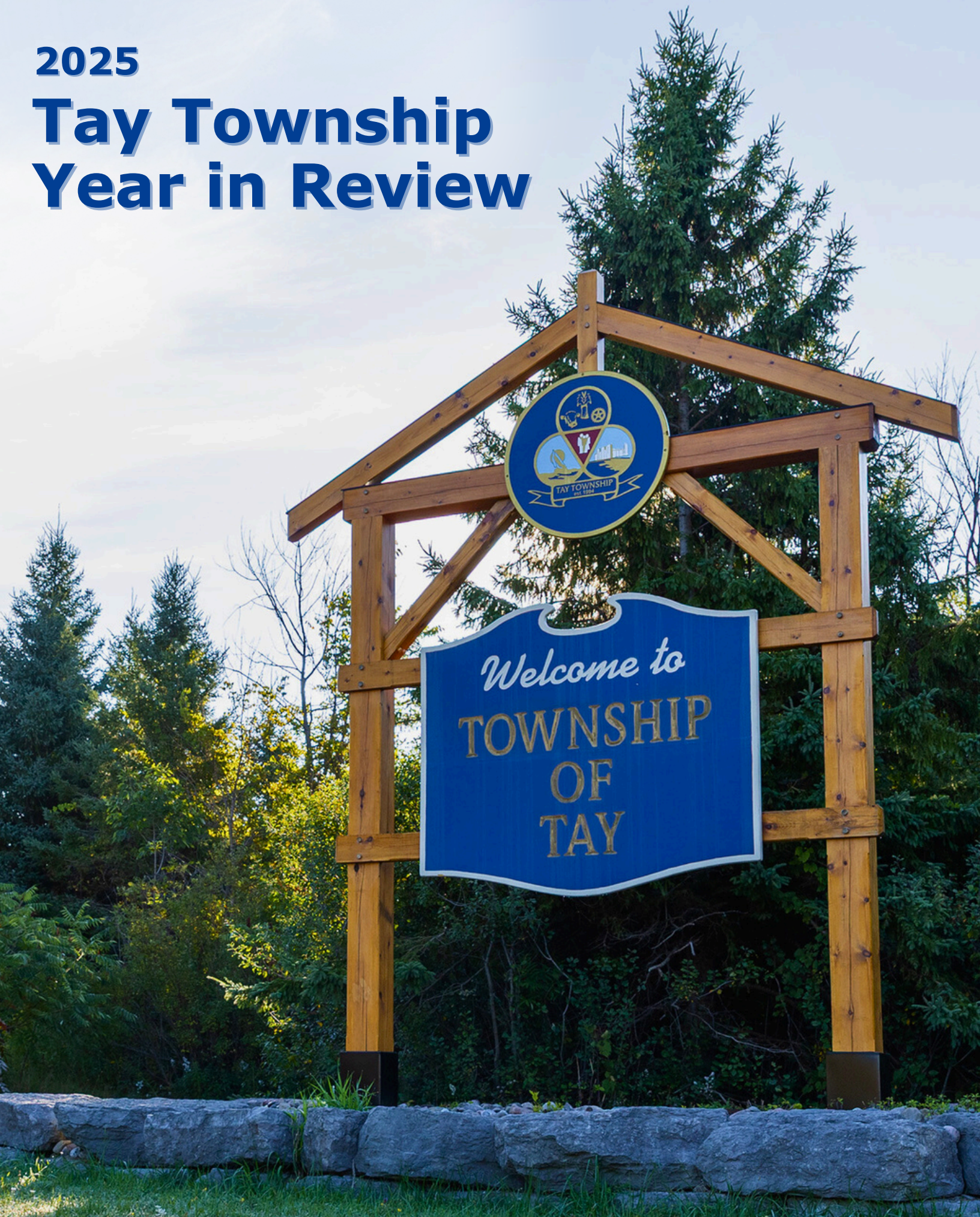

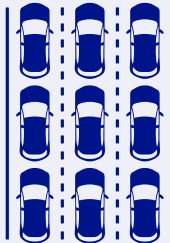

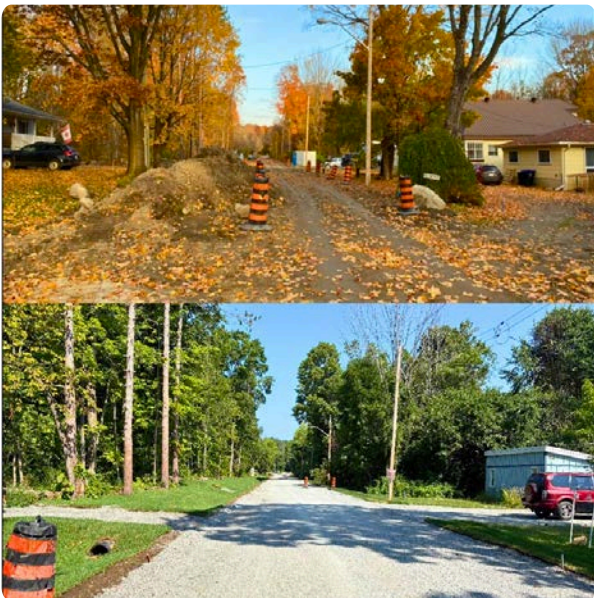

Rosemount Road Bridge 4 Replacement

This project involved replacing the original single-lane bridge, built in 1932, with a new 50-foot double-lane steel bridge. The project included installation of new guardrails and signage, along with culvert and drainage improvements to enhance water flow and drainage in the area. The roadway was paved up to the bridge to complete the connection. Construction was completed in approximately one month.



Fifth Avenue/Hayes Street Sanitary and Water Works

This project began in October 2024 and was completed in August 2025. The scope of work included the installation of a new sanitary main from Hayes Street to Arpin Street, providing 43 new sanitary service connections at the property line. The existing cast iron watermain was replaced with a new PVC watermain, along with new water services.

Road work included the installation of seven new cross culverts, placement of new road base material, and road re-grading. Restoration works included ditching to improve drainage, clearing, sodding, installation of new driveway culverts, and approximately 500 meters of new asphalt and gutter installation.

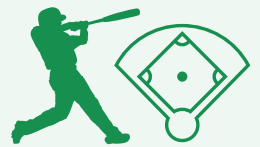

Tay Shore Trail Signage Rehabilitation

Three marquee trailheads signs were replaced, along with several 'Attraction, Interpretive and Historical' signs along the trail corridor. Many of these signs help to depict the vast historical information related to the various communities that make up Tay Township. Updates to the Regulatory Signage along the trail improved alignment with new by-law numbers and retro-reflectivity. All new signage received new 4' X 4' wooden posts.



Parks and Recreation Master Plan

Development of the Parks and Recreation Master Plan began in 2025, with significant work completed including public consultation, staff input, and engagement with planning consultants. While implementation will begin in 2026, launching the process in 2025 was a key achievement and reflects the Township's commitment to long-term, community-driven planning.

Watermain Replacements

Throughout 2025, multiple watermain replacement projects were completed to upgrade aging infrastructure and improve water quality and system reliability.

Old cast iron watermains were replaced with new PVC watermains on Elizabeth Street, McPhee Boulevard, Franklin Drive, Alberta Street, Second Avenue, Fifth Avenue, and Hayes Street. In total, approximately 1.29 km of watermain was replaced as part of these infrastructure improvements.

The **overall increase for a residential property tax bill for 2025** including **County and Education** taxes was **3.338%**.

For the **median residential home in Tay Township assessed at \$220,000** this is an increase of approximately **\$86.92 per year**.



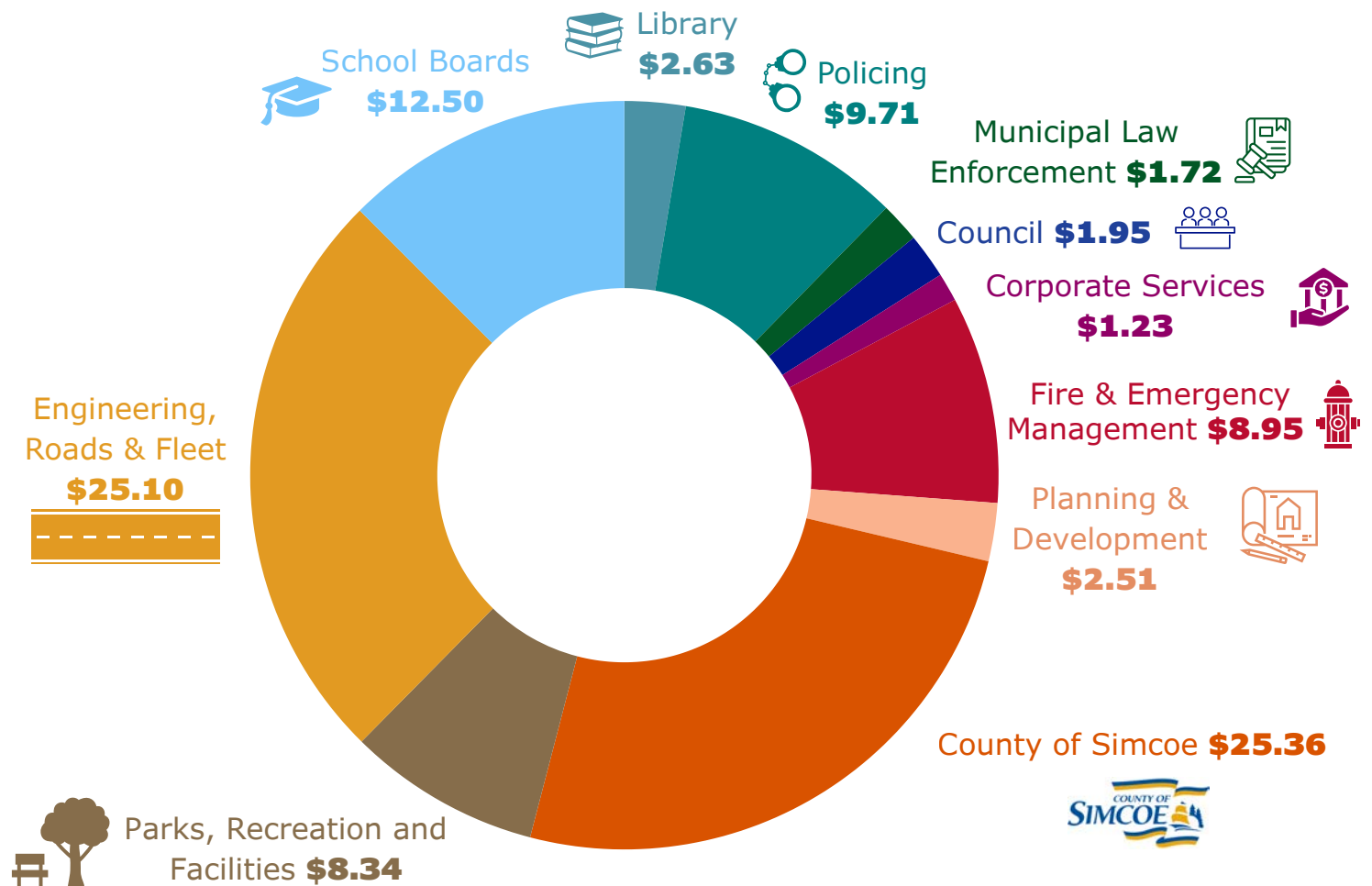
Per \$100 of property taxes collected:

Water and wastewater systems and building services are self-funded.
Operating costs are recovered through user fees and permit revenues, not general property taxes.

TEE OFF WITH TAY

The community came together in full force for the Mayor's Charity Golf Tournament, "Tee Off With Tay," held on Friday, August 15, 2025, at the Midland Golf & Country Club. The event proved to be a tremendous success, raising \$62,000 to support vital community initiatives.

\$6,000 to Tay Shores Public Elementary School and \$6,000 to St. Antoine Daniel Catholic Elementary School for nutrition programs, outdoor learning initiatives and technology enhancements, ensuring students have access to healthy meals, dynamic hands-on educational experiences and the digital tools needed to support their learning.

\$24,000 to Georgian Bay General Hospital for the acquisition of a Portable Patient Lift, essential for helping seniors and other patients maintain mobility, independence, and dignity during care.

\$26,000 to Waypoint Centre for Mental Health Care, helping bring programs and resources to frail older adults and their caregivers through the North Simcoe Muskoka Specialized Geriatric Services program. 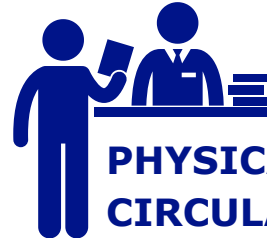

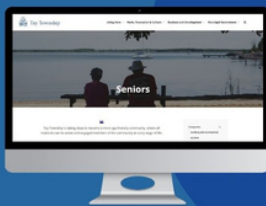
